
Dear Emergency Medicine Physicians,

AzCEP annual "ED DOC DAY" is coming up on March 13th at the State Capitol in Phoenix, AZ. It is an in-person event where we meet our state legislators (based on your home address), discuss important EM issues, current healthcare bills, attend committee meetings and develop connections with politicians, who vote on the bills that become a law. Such bills affect our practice of medicine, and we want to be proactive, "If you are not at the table, you're on the menu" (2). AzCEP has previously discussed with politicians the following bills: workplace violence, opioid crisis, EM GME funding, practicing medicine in AZ without any clinical rotations or residency in the USA and many more. Another bill example would be allowing pharmacists to prescribe antibiotics based on rapid strep test (without physical exam or culture). AzCEP members gave real live examples of why this bill would be dangerous and prevented it from passing.

This year ED boarding is on everyone's minds, given the deficiency of multidisciplinary staff and increase in patient visit volume. The fall and winter have had highest incidences of RSV, COVID and Influenza causing the CDC to issue an advisory letter encouraging physicians to promote vaccination (3). AzCEP issued a media statement on January 26th, 2024, in regard to Arizona ED Boarding. Our chapter statement for patients and media is posted on the front page of our website, along with other resources to help address this national crisis. Even though each hospital system has its own problems, you may be surprised how many similarities we have when it comes to bottlenecking at the level of the Emergency Department.

Our annual AzCEP membership meeting with elections is coming up on April 3rd at 5:30pm, and usually occurs in person in a restaurant in Phoenix area. On the agenda are updates about where we are headed and elections for new board members. All members are welcome!

My personal favorite ACEP meeting is the Leadership and Advocacy Conference (LAC#2024) and it is coming up from April 14th though April 16th, 2024, occurring in Washington, DC. This conference is on a much smaller scale and has a more intimate feel than the National ACEP Scientific Assembly conference in the fall. You will learn about solutions for current problems EM is facing and deliver a succinct message to your federal senators and representatives. Your work stories (HIPPA compliant) are encouraged and welcomed. This conference is a type of wellness retreat where you feel heard and valuable. LAC's cozy atmosphere makes it easy to connect with the national mentors and leaders.


Advanced Care of Older Adults Certificate

Legislative Update

It's February in Arizona and the legislature is running fast & furious. We just finished up week four of the 2024 legislative session with over 1,600 hundred bills, memorials & resolutions already introduced with another 200 more expected by the time the legislative session ends.

The big news is that State Representative (and AzCEP Board Member) Amish Shah has resigned from his position at the legislature so that he may focus all of his efforts on running for, and winning, the Arizona District 1 Congressional primary in August of 2024. The general election for that race will take place in November of 2024. Dr. Shah has been outstanding advocate for his constituents, the medical community AND the Emergency Doctors. He has relied on his background and experiences as an Emergency Department Doctor to educate legislators and successfully pass legislation in the state that benefits all of our health care. Although we will miss his insight and help at the state capitol, we may soon be seeing him in Washington, DC.

Representative Shah is only one of 4 House legislators who has left the House of Representatives over just the last 2 months. We are now near 10 (out of 90) legislators who have been appointed since 2023. That requires a lot of education on health care issues for those new members in a very short time frame. In addition, the next election for legislative seats is this fall so we will have even more new faces starting in 2025.

As for legislation, most is a repeat from last year with Scope of Practice issues and International Medical Graduates practice issues on the forefront along with a host other issues that can have a positive or negative affect on our medical groups. We already have over 225 bills that we are currently tracking that could have an impact on health care in Arizona if passed by the legislature and signed by the Governor.

I expect us to be in the 2024 legislative session until at least May, which would be an improvement from last year when the legislative session ran over until July 31st.

Finally, we will be holding the AzCEP ED Doc Day at the Capitol on Wednesday, March 13th. Please note that we have moved the starting time to 9 am. At this event, we will receive an update on important health-related legislation that is still moving through the legislative process and meeting with legislators to discuss these very issues and the impact that they could have on the health community.

See you in March at the Capitol!
